



2018 Alexander & Baldwin Sugar Museum Art Contest
“Plantation Days: How Sweet It Was”
Entry and Submission Criteria

- Open to all Maui students grades 3-12.
- One entry per student.
- Art must be complete and hand drawn (not computer generated) on paper. Size may not exceed 8 ½” x 11” unframed and unmounted.
- All mediums allowed: pencil, pen, paint, ink, crayon, etc.
- All entries must be sugar plantation themed: examples are: field, field worker, mill, mill worker, machinery, equipment or haulers, people and plantation camp life.
- Each entry must have attached to it a completed official entry form and consent form with student and parent or guardian signatures (required) and taped to the back of the artwork being submitted. No entries will be accepted without proper signed forms.
- Entries will be accepted at the Sugar Museum, 3957 Hansen Road, Puunene, or mailed to Sugar Museum, PO Box 125, Puunene, 96784.
- Mailed entries must be postmarked by March 15, 2018.
- Hand delivered entries must be received by 4 p.m. March 15, 2018.
- Artwork will be judged in three grade divisions: 3-5, 6-8, 9-12. Winners will be announced and notified by 5:00 p.m. March 22, 2018.
- Winning artwork in all grade categories will become an exhibit on display at the Sugar Museum for two months after judging. All other artwork will be available for pickup at the Sugar Museum 7 days a week, 9:30-4. **Please include a self-addressed, postage paid envelope if you wish to have your artwork mailed back to you.**
- The top three (3) winning contestants from each grade division will be awarded cash and other prizes and the winning artwork may be featured as merchandise for sale in the Sugar Museum Plantation Store. First place \$75, second place \$50, third place \$25.
